MOSER (State Bar No. 212686) MORRISON & FOERSTER LLP 425 Market Street San Francisco, California 94105-2482 Telephone: (415) 268-7000 Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 27 and Ninth Circuit Local Rule 27-1, Appellants Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative and Jeffrey Jones (collectively "Appellants") hereby move this Court for an order redesignating the lead case in the consolidated appeals numbered 02-16335, 02-15634, and 02-16715. Appellants request that this court enter an order designating Appellants' case (02-16534) as the lead case.

On appeal before this Court are three related cases¹ from the Northern

District of California: (1) *United States v. Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative*(02-16534); (2) *United States v. Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana* (0216335); and (3) *United States v. Ukiah Cannabis Buyers' Club* (02-16715). Each
of the appellants has noticed an appeal from the district court's final judgment,
which consists of: (1) the district court's Memorandum and Order dated May 3,
2002 granting summary judgment in favor of plaintiff-appellee; and (2) the district
court's Order dated June 10, 2002 issuing a permanent injunction. For the
foregoing reasons, on November 25, 2002, appellants and appellees in all three
actions moved this Court jointly for an order consolidating the cases. All three
cases were consolidated and the briefing schedules coordinated by an order of this
Court dated December 20, 2002.

On January 22, 1998, Judge Charles R. Breyer of the Northern District of California consolidated these three actions as related actions pursuant to Local

Per the arrangement of the parties and as reflected in the December 20, 2002 consolidation order of this Court, Appellants' briefs have served as the briefs for all three appeals. In fact, appellants in United States v. Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana (02-16335) and United States v. Ukiah Cannabis Buyers' Club (02-16715) have simply filed one-page joinders of the briefs filed by Appellants. Despite the fact that Appellants are most actively involved in pursuing this appeal, the lead case currently listed on the docket sheet is United States v. Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana (02-16335). This is presumably due to the fact that the Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana filed its notice of appeal first.² The customary procedure in the Ninth Circuit, as understood by Appellants, is to list the lowest numbered case as the lead case, which, in the present case, is United States v. Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana (02-16335). There is nothing in the either the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure or the Ninth Circuit Local Rules that mandates that the first-filed notice of appeal dictate the lead case for the purpose of the caption in consolidated appeals.

² The notice of appeal in *United States v. Marin Alliance for Medical Marijuana* (02-16335) was filed on July 9, 2002. The notices of appeal in *United States v. Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative* (02-16534) and *United States v. Ukiah Cannabis Buyers' Club* (02-16715) were filed on August 1, 2002 and September 4, 2002, respectively.

Counsel for all three appellants have agreed that these consolidated appeals should proceed with *United States v. Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative* (02-16534) as the lead case. In addition, the United States government is not opposed to this motion.

For the following reasons, Appellants respectfully request that this Court enter an order designating *United States v. Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative* (02-16534) as the lead case in the consolidated appeals.
