defendants to comply with that part of the injunction which the Court found defendants had violated, the Court modified the preliminary injunction to provide as follows:

The United States Marshal is empowered to enforce this Preliminary Injunction. In particular, the United States Marshal is authorized to enter the premises of the Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California, at any time of the day or night, evict any and all tenants, inventory the premises, and padlock the doors, until such time that defendants can satisfy the Court that they are no longer in violation of the injunctive order and that they would in good faith thereafter comply with the terms of the order

October 13, 1998 Order.

In response to the Court's order modifying the injunction, defendants voluntarily closed the Cooperative at 1755 Broadway and gave the key to the Cooperative to the United States Marshal's Office. Defendants now seek an order permitting them to reenter the premises at 1755 Broadway to conduct activities other than the manufacture or distribution of marijuana.

The Court is satisfied that defendants are no longer in violation of the injunctive order and that they will in good faith comply with the terms of the order. Defendant Jeffrey Jones, the Executive Director of defendant Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative, has submitted a declaration in which he attests that he will follow the terms of the injunction with respect to the premises at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California and will take all reasonable steps to ensure compliance by the Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative with the injunction. Since defendants have declared they will not use the premises at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana, there is no reason to keep them out of the premises to ensure that they will not use the premises for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana.

Accordingly, upon the expressed representation of defendants' Jeffrey Jones and the Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Club that they will not manufacture or distribute marijuana at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California, or use the premises at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana, the Court will vacate the modification to the preliminary injunction issued on October 13, 1998. The Court will permit defendants to reenter the premises provided they do not engage in the manufacture or

distribution of marijuana from those premises, or use the premises for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, defendants' ex parte motion is hereby GRANTED in part.

The October 13, 1998 modification to the May 19, 1998 preliminary injunction is hereby

VACATED. The May 19, 1998 preliminary injunction is hereby modified as follows:

The Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative and Jeffrey Jones may reenter the premises at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California, provided they do not engage in the manufacture or distribution of marijuana from those premises, or use the premises for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana.

If the plaintiff believes in good faith that defendants have violated the preliminary injunction by manufacturing or distributing marijuana at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California, or using the premises at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California for the purpose of manufacturing or distributing marijuana, the United States Marshal is authorized to enter the premises of the Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative at 1755 Broadway, Oakland, California, at any time of the day or night, evict any all tenants, inventory the premises, and padlock the doors, until a hearing before the Court, which hearing shall be held forthwith.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
